Light is a form of energy. When light hits an object, some light is reflected. Reflected light changes direction and keeps moving in a straight line.

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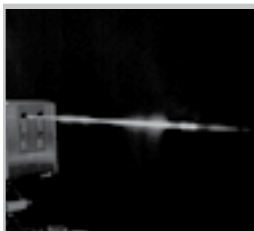

Sab hnuv yog ib hom zog. Thaum sab hnuv raug ib yam khoom, tej cov sab hnuv tig rov. Cov sab hnuv tig rov hloov lawv txoj sab thiab lawm ncaj qha.



Light is a **form of energy**. Some light energy is visible; some is invisible. (pp. 348–349)

Sab hnuv yog ib **hom zog**. Tej cov zog sab hnuv pom tau; tej cov pom tsis tau. (pp. 348–349)



Light travels in a **straight path**. The light that bounces off an object is a **reflection**. (pp. 350–351)

Sab hnuv tawm raws **kab ncaj qha**. Cov sab hnuv uas dhia tawm ntawm ib yam khoom yog sab **duab tig ci**. (pp. 350–351)



If light hits a **smooth surface**, a clear image forms. Light that hits a **rough surface** scatters. (pp. 350–351)

Yog sab hnuv raug ib daim **plag du**, ib tus duab cev tseeb tshwm tau. Sab hnuv uas raug ib daim **plag ntxhib** nthuav ri tawm. (pp. 350–351)
